

Bleaching powder drive to curb monsoon diseases



With the onset of the rainy season and rising health concerns in peripheral villages, Adhunik Power has initiated a campaign to prevent diarrhea, malaria and other waterborne diseases.

The drive covered Padampur, Srirampur, Chhotahariharpur, Virdhwajpur, and Bikanipur where spraying operations were carried out and bleaching powder was distributed to residents. The move aims to tackle unhygienic conditions, contaminated water sources and mosquito breeding—identified as major causes of last year's diarrhea outbreak.

The initiative also seeks to create greater community awareness about sanitation and preventive measures to safeguard health during the monsoon season.

Support to TB patients with nutritious food

Adhunik Power, under its Nikshay Mitra program is providing monthly nutritious food support to underprivileged TB patients in Gamharia block to help improve their diet and recovery.

The packets consist of essential food items such as moong, jaggery, chana, arhar dal, soybean, oatmeal, oats, oil and chura aimed at boosting nutrition among beneficiaries.
